
Winter Storm Safety

- Stay off the roads & avoid tree limbs.
- Limit your time outside.
- Avoid carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning. Double check the batteries in your CO detector.
- Reduce the risk of a heart attack avoid overexertion when shoveling.
- Watch for signs of frostbite & hypothermia.
- Check on your neighbors.
- Keep an emergency kit in your car.



COVID-19 Data Updates: Cases


- Majority of new cases are Omicron variant but Delta is still here.
- Current case numbers are **nearly tripled** what we have seen in previous COVID waves/surges.
- At-home tests are not always counted in our COVID data.
- Numbers are important but it's more important for us to think about the greater impact this has on our society, economy, and healthcare systems.






COVID-19 Data Updates: Vaccinations


Percent of the Eligible Population Fully Vaccinated - By Sex

COVID-19 Hospitalizations and the Impact on **Hospital Systems**

- **Emergency Department Strain** Dr. Williams
 - Know when to visit the ED & consider all options when possible.
 - When possible, utilize other testing resources for COVID testing.
- Admission and Staff Strain Dr. Bell
 - As of today (January 10), UVA Health has 89 admitted patients for COVID-19 (25 in ICU).
 - Unvaccinated patients make up the majority of hospitalizations.

Monoclonal Antibodies & Oral Treatment

- Very limited supply of treatment. Prevention is our best strategy.
- Vaccination & boosters remains our best defense against severe infections, hospitalizations, and death.





COVID-19 Vaccine Updates

- Everyone ages 5+ is now eligible for a COVID-19 vaccine
- Booster update:
 - All ages 12+ now eligible for a Pfizer booster dose
 - Pfizer boosters now 5 months after 2nd dose (rather than previous 6 month guideline) for all ages 12+

Pediatric COVID-19 Vaccine Update

January 2022

INCREASED BOOSTER ELIGIBILITY

The CDC has authorized Pfizer booster doses for adolescents ages 12 years and older.

LESS TIME BETWEEN DOSES

If your initial COVID-19 vaccine was Pfizer, you are now able to get your Pfizer Booster shot 5 months after your second dose*.


IMMUNO-COMPROMISED CHILDREN


The CDC authorized a third dose of vaccine for certain immunocompromised children ages 5-11 years old.

New CDC Isolation & Quarantine Guidelines: Businesses





Businesses may follow the new guidelines IF they can be adhered to properly. This includes strict enforcement of high quality, secure fitting mask over nose and mouth (N95, K95, KF94, surgical) for days 6-10 of isolation period.

Everyone should wear masks at all times when at work.


Telework when possible.






BRHD Recommendations for Schools & Daycares: Isolation & Quarantine Guidelines

GOAL: Minimize risk and support school operations to keep children in classrooms.









COVID-19 Testing Resources

- Testing available in all localities hosted by BRHD, NEXT Molecular, & UVA Health
- Blue Ridge Community Testing Center (BR CTC)
 - Pantops Shopping Center (next to Food Lion) → Saturday-Thursday, 9am-5:30pm
 - By appointment only (on VASE+)



- BRHD-run test sites are by appointment only
 - No walk-ins at Local Health Departments or on Fridays outside JCPenney
- Test results are taking up to 3-4 days if testing because of symptoms, it is safest to isolate & assume you are COVID positive until your results are returned
- Testing is weather dependent.
- Preparing a larger tent at the JCPenney Fashion Square Mall site.

Testing Reminders

- Confirm onsite the testing provider (organization or business name) & how you get your results
- BRHD staff is working hard to provide the best service possible
- Remember that local pharmacies, your primary care provider, and urgent care centers offer testing as an alternative
