






% wearing masks in public most or all the time October 7, 2020






### COVID-19 in TJHD Data Overview







### **COVID Care Support Services**

Organized by Cultivate Charlottesville and community leaders, supported by a variety of community partners

#### Who is served?

- First request received May 25, 2020
- Tested positive at Sentara/UVA community testing sites were given a phone number to request services (by their resulting physician). Last week, Case Investigators started screening/referrals for Charlottesville and Albemarle.
- Received requests from 47 households (218 individuals)

#### What support services are available?

- Per flyer: If you receive a positive COVID test result and you will struggle with providing food, paying bills, or getting
  prescriptions/ medication during the isolation period, LET US KNOW!
- Depending on request/capacity: boxed shelf-stable foods, prepared meals, fresh produce, and/or PPE and sanitation supplies, medication, financial assistance

COVID Care is coordinated by Cultivate Charlottesville, City of Charlottesville, County of Albemarle, Thomas Jefferson Health District, and the UVA Equity Center. Support services are provided by the Blue Ridge Area Food Bank, Charlottesville Community Cares, City of Charlottesville Department of Human Services, Cultivate Charlottesville, Frontline Foods/Harvest Moon Catering/World Central Kitchen, Salvation Army, UVA Equity Center, and UVA Health.

### Public Health Successes

Latino engagement and co-development of public messaging, mask distribution through Promotoras (Albemarle)

Partnered to develop Community Resource Guide for Cville/Alb and edited/shared for other localities

Shifted contractor hiring process to focus on hiring from communities impacted disproportionately by COVID

Partnered with a private donor to purchase/distribute >60,000 masks through libraries, pantries, faith-based groups, small businesses etc. This will include City/County schools in November

### Challenges and Opportunities

Human services positions, community health worker positions in government are extremely limited but critical for relationship/trust-building

Long-term disinvestment can't be remedied by short-term, response-specific funding

Change in policy makers/staffing over time – impact continuity of equity initiatives if not built-in to ordinances/policies/culture

Fatigue - COVID is a marathon; impacts are just starting

Continuing to center equity as a core value rather than an additional task
